

I don't want to do this! It's too hard, too upsetting, too...confounding!

So, you want me to do more of it?

You've seen the famous medical symbol—the snake on the pole. In Numbers 21, God used a symbol of the very problem to be solved as the solution to the problem—snakebite victims had to stare at the image of a snake—so in the New Testament, we look to the very thing that frightens us the most—death itself—and somehow find there a path to an eternal life that means death no longer has the final word for any of us.

God made the sinless one to be treated as the most sinful one ever.

God made the eternally alive Son of God die.

Now for the rest of us: get some of that death into you, and you will live after all.

Strange. Striking. Unexpected. Offensive, even.

Wait, isn't that how vaccines work?

That's how God dealt with the scourge of sin and its grim wage of death: he inoculated us with a bit of that very thing through our baptism into Christ. We die with Christ so that death cannot do its dirty, final work in us. The Holy Spirit comes to live in us and knows just what to do when death comes knocking (as it still does for each one of us). In baptism, we have all been there before when it comes to death, and so the eternal life that Christ gave us knows what to do to kick death out once and for all.

That's what Jesus came to do, and maybe that is why he goes on—after the most famous verse in the Bible—to say in verse 17 that God did not send his Son into the world to condemn it.

Really? Running away from the problem, or condemning it, seems so much easier.

God's ways are not our ways. But they could be.

Do you believe it?

Come celebrate and pray with us on Sunday. As we make our Lenten journey, we know we need reconciliation, we have to look upon the cross.

I'll see you Sunday. Please pray for me.



Paul's Letter to the Romans


